GEODETICS AWARDED A SEAPORT ENHANCED (SEAPORT-E) CONTRACT BY THE U.S. NAVY

La Jolla, California – June 2005 – The U.S. Navy has awarded a Seaport Enhanced (Seaport-e) contract to Geodetics, a leader in high precision positioning and navigation based on Global Positioning Systems (GPS).

An estimated \$5.3 billion in services will be procured each year through the contract vehicle, according to government officials. The award carries a four-year base period with one five-year award term and an additional one-year award term. "Geodetics is proud to win this important Seaport-e contract and we are confident that we will deliver excellent work," said Dr. Lydia Bock, VP Business Development of Geodetics.

Task orders under the Seaport-e Multiple Award Contract (MAC) vehicle can be issued by Naval Sea Systems, Naval Air Systems, Space and Naval Warfare Systems, Naval Supply Systems, Military Sealift and Naval Facilities as well as Strategic Systems Programs and the U.S. Marine Corps. Additionally, limited support may be provided under this contract to other Department of Defense (DoD), non-DoD and joint agencies for work that is integrally related to product areas and mission.

"This is an important win for Geodetics because to do any business with the Navy in the future, you must have a Seaport-e contract," Dr. Bock said.

Geodetics Inc., a Woman Owned Small Business (WOSB), was founded in 1999, and is privately held with headquarters in San Diego, California. Geodetics develops and markets real-time, high-precision, and extended spatial coverage GPS positioning and navigation solutions.

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
